### DRAFT MINUTES BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

A meeting of the Vernon Board of Education was held in-person and via Zoom Webinar at the Administration Building on Monday, November 13, 2023.

#### 0.0 Call to Order

Dr. Joseph Macary, Superintendent of Schools, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. He invited Mrs. Karen Daigle, Vernon Town Clerk, to come forward to swear-in the newly elected Board of Education members.

#### 1.0 Swearing in of New Board of Education Members

The following Board members were sworn in by Town Clerk Karen Daigle:

Dr. Macary then called for a moment of silence in honor of Frank Campanelli, Mrs. Daigle's father, who passed away last Tuesday. He thanked Mrs. Daigle for taking time away from her family to be here this evening to swear in the new Board members. Dr. Macary welcomed the new Board members to the 2023-2025 Board of Education.

#### 2.0 Establish Quorum

Roll call was taken at 7:05 p.m.

CRS Principal Mrs. Heather Earley introduced her team, which included Assistant Principal Mrs. Lori Purcaro, 4th Grade Math teachers Mr. McNamar, Ms. Tran, Mrs. Giannelli and Ms. Caffery as well as 8-4<sup>th</sup> Grade math students. Mr. McNamar led the students in their demonstration. The students were instructed to show how they find different ways to solve math problems. They worked in groups on white boards and talked about their strategy out loud with one another. They also displayed various hand signals of communication that they use in the classroom. In conclusion, the students showed how they could use different methods to solve a given math problem and come up with the same answer.

#### 6.2 Rockville High School Student Representative Report

My-Ngoc Lai-Huyen reported on the following:

- As of November 13<sup>th</sup>, 49 Seniors have submitted college applications. This is approximately 20% of the class.
- As of November 6<sup>th</sup>, RHS has hosted 42 colleges and universities. Interested RHS students are able to meet with admissions representatives during these visits.
- On October 27<sup>th</sup>, the School Counseling Department took 52 Seniors for an informational session and tour of the UConn Storrs campus.
- RHS celebrated Veterans' Day with an assembly on Friday for veterans.
- The football team won their game last Thursday against Stafford, 35-0.

budget to the Town, asking for what they thought they would need to run the schools. The Town Council subsequently cut 1.6 million dollars from the proposed BOE budget. The tax payers voted the budget down in a referendum because they thought it didn't have enough to run the schools. The Town reconsidered and put 1 million dollars back in the budget and it subsequently passed. Mr. Winkler asked the Board to carefully consider what they think it will take to run the District next year and present that number to the Town.

Mr. Testa shared the results of the 2022-2023 Next Generation Accountability Index with the Board. This report provides a more complete picture of a school or district. His presentation included three segments: a detailed PowerPoint of the results and how they compare to the State and other districts; the actual reports downloaded from the State site; a PowerPoint presentation with instruction on how to read the results. He reviewed the 12 indicators and Vernon's results within each. For the 2022-2023 school year, Vernon Public Schools performed above the State of CT average in 18 out of 23 indicators. VPS earned 70% or better in 14 out of 23 indicators. The State earned 70% or better in 9 out of 23 indicators. One area of concern is attendance. Vernon Public Schools had a higher absenteeism rate than the State and we need to work on this. Mr. Testa also announced that two of Vernon's schools were named "Schools of Distinction" based on overall performance, growth and change in overall performance. They are Maple Street School and Northeast School.

#### 11.0 General Business

Dr. Macary announced that budget season is upon us and budget workshops will begin in January. He presented the proposed Budget Meeting Calendar for the Board's review and approval. Mr. Grabowski explained to the new Board members that this will be a very busy time where the Board will hammer out the Superintendent's proposed budget before approving and presenting to the Mayor for his review and the Town's approval. He said it is important for all Board members to attend each session noted on the calendar.

This will require us to close school for that day and add a day to the end of the school calendar. Dr. Macary is proposing that Vernon Public Schools close on November 28<sup>th</sup>, resulting in the last day of school now being June 13<sup>th</sup> rather than June 12<sup>th</sup>.




