


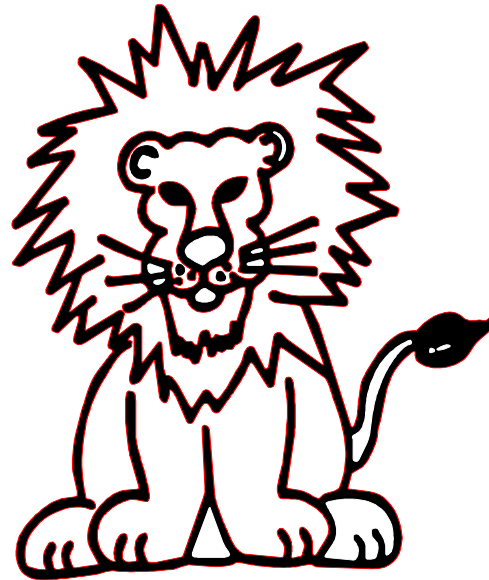

Be Involved at Home!
