These skills have led to 5 of our students achieving gainful employment during this school year, more than any previous year. Our participants have also made a commitment to further their education, whether this was through college classes at Manchester Community College or looking into classes through Vernon Regional Adult Education.

We added a new business partner midyear with Vernon Public Works. They have opened their bay doors to have our participants gain knowledge in the field of auto mechanics. We also made additions to our Adult Daily Living skills lessons. These lessons revolved around role playing social interactions in the work place to prepare our students to be well rounded employees.

As we look forward to our 14th year of

As we maneuver our way through this crazy winter season, the students have been actively involved in many activities. I have incorporated some new activities to their program including the EnvisionIT transition curriculum. I am constantly assessing student progress. Their program will be designed on their individual needs and progress. We have been doing a lot with social skills and have designated Wednesday's as our social/communication day. I partner with Gabriella Badea our speech clinician to develop appropriate social lessons utilized in the community. The Unified Program has had a busy basketball season. We just had our Rockville Jamboree on March 1<sup>st</sup> with South Windsor, Rham and Ellington; which was a great success. The band and honor society helped support the event by providing constant music and awesome refreshments. The next East of The River Bowling Tournament at Spare Time in Vernon is scheduled for Monday March 19<sup>th</sup> from 3-4:30. I am anticipating over 100 athletes in attendance. Our weekly cooking lessons continue to be a favorite for the participants and help teach important independent living skills. Each week, a different participant is given the opportunity to make a recipe of his/her liking. Then, this student helps lead the lesson from shopping to preparing the meal.
